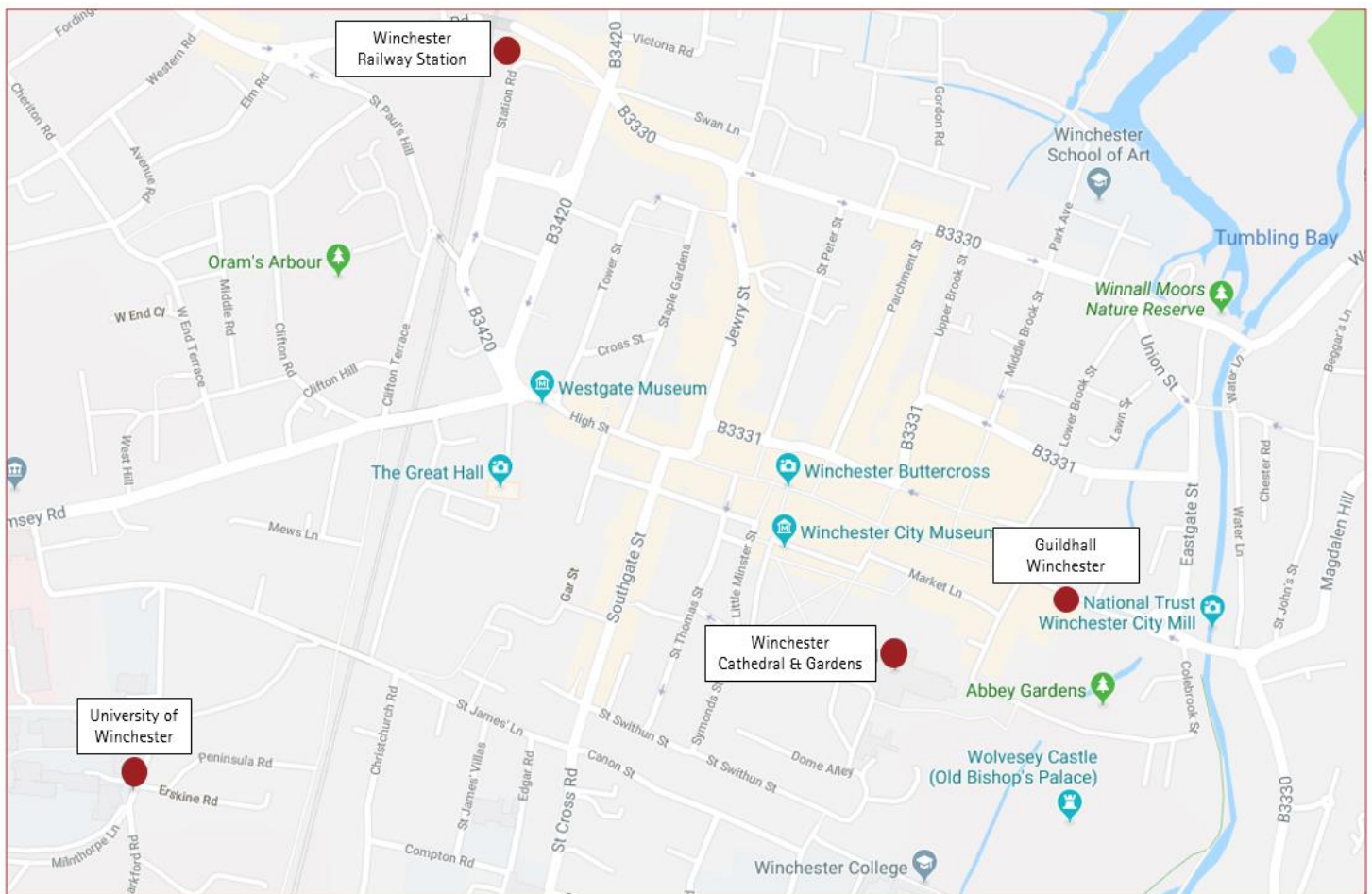

CONFERENCE VENUE - UNIVERSITY CENTRE

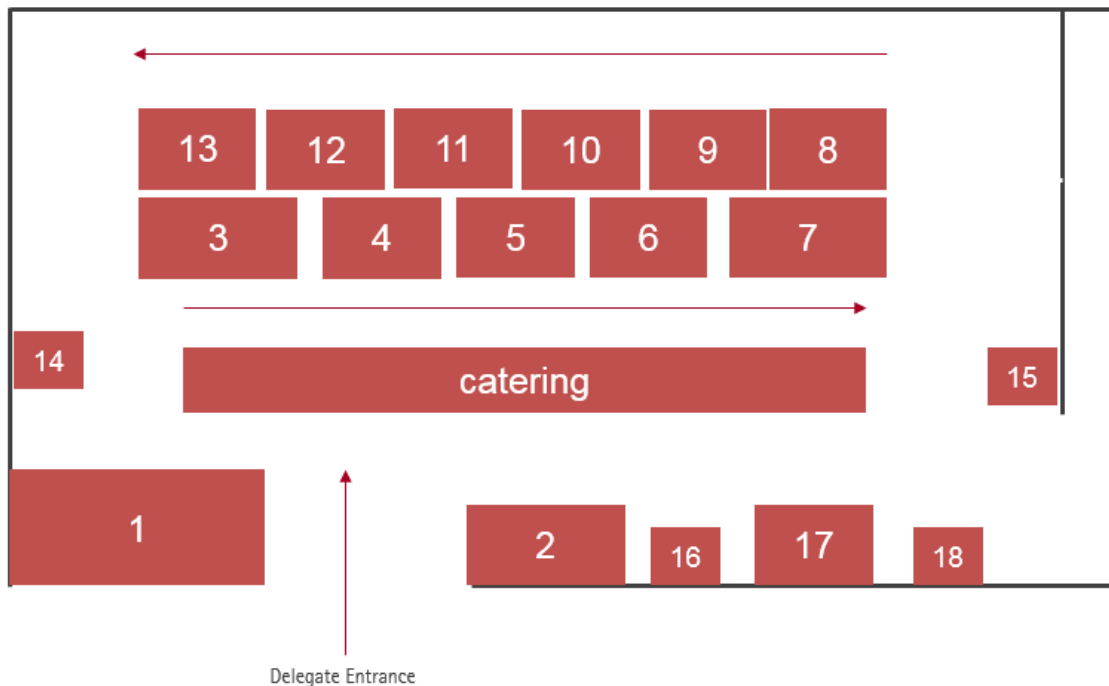
- Level 1 (technically ground floor) – The Vault – Poster Area

DINING OUT

Winchester is quite a foodie destination and there are restaurants to suit every palate and occasion! There are many options for dining in Winchester although you may wish to pre book, as these places can get busy. 10 restaurants within 10 minutes stroll of Winchester Cathedral:

[The Ivy](#)

Newly opened bistro restaurant and part of the famous London brand. Great décor and bar, good quality food and excellent service

[Wykeham Arms Winchester](#)

Really characterful typical English pub with a high-quality restaurant. Recommended for either a few beers or a nice meal.

[Rick Stein](#)

One of the only restaurants from the famous chef and TV presenter outside of Cornwall. Not surprisingly, a mainly fish-based menu. Good food if uninspiring décor.

[Chesil Rectory](#)

One of oldest buildings in Winchester with a fascinating history. Very good quality food, recommended in Sunday Times as one of most romantic restaurants in England

[River Cottage](#)

An old mill house building in Abbey Mill Gardens overlooking a stream. Nicely renovated building with a generally healthy and tasty menu; part of the Hugh Fearnley-Whittingstall chain.

[The Black Rat](#)

The only Michelin starred restaurant in Winchester as part of a small local chain of excellent "Black" products! Booking essential and often booked up many weeks in advance.

[Brasserie Blanc](#)

Yet another chain named after a famous chef. More good French bistro style food in a normally quite buzzy atmosphere.

[The Corner House](#)

Tucked down the end of a residential street in a old pub, this very friendly local restaurant serves from a good quality and frequently changing menu. Well worth a visit.

[Manow Thai](#)

Family run Thai restaurant in a rather unattractive building but with good service and good food. Don't judge a book by its cover!

[Tom's Deli](#)

Informal café style locally run Italian which is popular for pizza and simple Italian food. Small and often very busy.
